# Volunteers at Wild Animal Orphanage locked out of own building

They care for more than 400 exotic animals, but now these volunteers are feeling a little tied up.

Saturday morning, volunteers at the Wild Animal Orphanage showed up to feed the animals but found the locks had been changed. Police were called and eventually opened the doors so that the animals could be fed.

WOA director Nicole Garcia says the animals are not in danger and will not be euthanized. The center is currently closed to the public due to administrative issues.
