General Comment

Nevada State has very good existing regulations regarding native and injurious wildlife. Pythons, boas or anacondas are NOT in this category, as it freezes here during winter nights and these big reptiles couldn't survive here.

Other reason is lack of hiding places and prey base for big ambush reptile predators.
